Suitable for KS3; History

Skills focus: Chronological understanding; Historical enquiry

Develop pupils' enquiry and evidence handling skills using a range of original and replica material about the site to illustrate change and continuity in the local area.

CRIME IN THE AGE OF INDUSTRY

Suitable for KS3; History, Citizenship

Skills focus: Historical enquiry

What are the links between crime and the social and economic changes of the Industrial era? Pupils will use observation, reasoning and enquiry skills to reach their own conclusions.

EXPRESSIVE ART

Suitable for KS3; Art & Design, Citizenship

Skills focus: Exploring and developing ideas; Investigating and making art

Pupils will use their eyes, ears and imagination to explore the contrast between freedom and captivity for prisoners past and present and produce their own piece of creative art.

MARY BLANDY

Suitable for KS3; History, English, Drama, Citizenship

Skills focus: Historical enquiry; Historical interpretation; Speaking & listening

Sift, question and analyse the evidence to decide if Mary Blandy deserved her fate and her notoriety in the case that scandalized the county in the 18th Century.

KS3 GEOGRAPHY

Skills focus: Knowledge and understanding of places

Use a visit to Unlocked – Oxford Castle to discuss the changing land use of the area, the importance of tourism to the city and the economic impact of redevelopment.

GCSE CRIME AND PUNISHMENT

Suitable for KS4; History

Skills focus: Comprehending, analysing & evaluating evidence

Pupils can gather and analyse a variety of evidence on site, illustrating change from 12th to 21st Century, to support GCSE Crime and Punishment coursework and core study units. A visit can be tailored to suit your learning needs.
